





How to Make a Sundial What you need: sharp pencil erayons ruler thumb tacks plastic straw paper plate What to do: 1. Use the sharp pencil to poke a hole through the very centre of the plate. 2. Put the plate upside down. 3. Write the number 12 on the edge of the plate with a crayon. 4. Using the ruler as a guide, draw a straight line from the number 12 to the hole in the centre of the plate. 5. On a sunny day, take the plate outside at noon (12.00 pm). 6. Put the plate on the ground and poke the straw through the hole. 7. Turn the plate so that the shadow of the straw falls along the line to the number 12. 8. Using your thumb tacks, fasten the plate to the ground. 9. One hour later, at one o'clock, check the position of the shadow along the edge of the plate and write the number 1 on that spot. 10. Use the positions of the 12 and 1 to predict the positions of the other numbers on the sundial 11. The next day, take your sundial out and you will be able to tell the time without a clock






It was time to take Victoria, our pedigree Labrador, and Charles, our son, for a walk.

her all over the park.




I ordered it to go away, but it took no notice of me whatsoever. "Sit," I said to Charles. "Here."



I was just planning what we should have to eat that evening when I saw Charles had disappeared. Oh dear! Where had he gone?




You get some frightful types in the park these days! I called his name for what seemed like an age.




Then I saw him talking to a very rough-looking child. "Charles, come here. At once!" I said. "And come here please, Victoria."




I needed to get out of the house, so me and Smudge took the dog to the park.











I settled on a bench and looked through the paper for a job. I know it's a waste of time really, but you've got to have a bit of hope, haven't you?




Then it was time to go. Smudge cheered me up. She chatted happily to me all the way home.






I was at home on my own again.

It's so boring. Then Mummy said that it was time for our walk.




There was a very friendly dog in the park and Victoria was having a great time. I wished I was.

The two dogs raced round like old friends.




The girl took off her coat and swung on the climbing frame, so I did the same.







Dad had been really fed up, so I was pleased when he said we could take Albert to the park.








We both burst out laughing when we saw Albert having a swim.

World Biomes





What is a Biome?

A biome is a natural area of plants and animals. The world is divided into lots of different biomes and they are all different depending on their climate.









Types of Biomes

There is no exact number when it comes to types of Biomes, but many people believe there are six main ones:

Aquatic

This is the largest biome out there, covering nearly 75% of our planet and can be divided into two main categories: freshwater and saltwater.



Desert

These biomes cover about one fifth of our planet's land area and are extremely dry. Depending on their location, they can be either hot or cold. Plants and animals have evolved over time to adapt to the harsh environment.



Types of Biomes

Forest

Forest biomes are home to a variety of trees and other plants. They cover about 30% of our Earth's land area and are extremely important to our ecosystem as they store carbon and provide many materials that we use.



Grassland

The majority of this biome is made up of a variety of grasses with very few trees or large plants. The two main types of grasslands found are 'tall-grass' (humid and wet), and 'short-grass' (dry). This biome is very popular for farming due to the rich soil.



Types of Biomes

Rainforest

Home to a variety of tropical plants and animals and found in regions that are warm all year round. Unfortunately, rainforests now cover less than 6% of our planet's land area but still produce about 40% of our oxygen.



Tundra

This is the coldest biome and therefore has little plant and animal variety. Tundra biomes cover approximately one fifth of the Earth's land area.
