





Near Darwin, there is a place called Arnhem Land and there are 6 seasons there. (Kudjewk, Bangkerreng, Wurrkeng, Kurrung and Kunumeleng).  The Aboriginal community in Arnhem Land is the Gunbalanya people, the community in Sydney is the Biddigal people, and there are many other language groups throughout Australia.  Read the book 'Ernie Dances to the didgeridoo' <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PbEjwdXrc98">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PbEjwdXrc98</a> Choose one of the seasons mentioned in the book. Tell your teacher some of the things that Ernie or his friends do in the book during that season. For example, "In Kurrung, the hot dry season, Patrick and his little sisters eat icypoles."	Pretend that you are in Arnhem Land. Draw a picture of what you would do in your favourite season. Look at what the characters in the book did during those seasons to help you.  E.g. Your favourite Aboriginal Season may be Kudjewk, the monsoon season. You could draw yourself surfing in the puddles like Sammi did in the book.  OR  Wurrkeng, the early dry season. You could draw yourself catching a file snake like Tammy.  Be creative! Make sure to draw with detail and colour in your picture! You can use any materials you like, including crayons, paint, collage paper, leaves or twigs from outside etc.
