	Ask someone to help you collect 20 objects. Practise counting your collection, forwards and backwards. You could even try starting from different numbers (eg, start with 5 objects and keep counting).  Count how many steps it takes to get from your bedroom to the kitchen and back.	Number hunt: what numbers can you find in your house? Can you find all the numbers from zero to twenty? Try writing these numbers in your scrapbook, for example the numbers on a remote control or a clock. Can you find numbers on shoes, on food in the cupboard or in the fridge?	Practise cutting a piece of paper in half. How do you know the parts are equal? Is there another way you can make half?  When you are making your lunch today, practise counting and sharing items. For example, can you cut your sandwich in half?  Can you count out scoops of rice for each	Shape hunt: What shapes can you find in your house? Draw a picture out of these shapes. Describe your picture to a family member and ask them to help you write down the names of the shapes. Choose some objects in your house. Order them from shortest to longest.	Collect some blocks, pencils, pens, dried pasta, dried beans, etc. Make a repeating pattern. Draw your pattern in your workbook. Describe your pattern to a family member. Can you make another pattern using the same materials? Draw your second pattern.

# deas to develop literacy

#### Playdough

use to create letters, words or objects to match a word

### Magnetic letters

- match letters to letters or words in a familiar book or to sight words
- sort letters by colour or shape
- make rhyming words by changing the initial letter e.g. cat, mat, hat
- make new words by changing initial or final letters e.g. can, cap, map, mop, top
  - use letters to make any words they know e.g. their name

#### Sorting

- Sort pictures based on their initial sounds e.g. desk, duck
- Sort pictures/words with a particular vowel e.g. a: hat, cat; o: mop, box

#### Matching

- Match words to pictures or pictures to words
  - Puzzles matching picture to word
- Match sentence beginnings and endings (type a simple sentence and cut up for child to put back together and then read the sentence to check)
  - Match labels (e.g. post-it notes) to objects around the house
- Sight word cards Give 2 of each word (shuffled) for child to match up.

#### Locating

- Find all the words on a page which begin with a certain letter
- Peer reading

Find known sight words on a page of a book you are reading together

- Read to a sibling or different family member
- Retell or talk about a book they have read to another person

#### Drawing

Draw a picture of their favourite character or scene from a book

## Shopping Catalogues

Browse and ask your child to name (verbally) or label (in writing) known objects e.g. food items Listening - with headphones

#### Handwriting

- Sand tray or soft sand paper use their finger to 'write' letters or words
  - 'Write' their letters or words in the air using their finger
    - Write on an easel (supports pencil grip)
- Rainbow spelling write known words or spelling words in different colours
