### Principal's Message

One of the three Strategic Directions which form our current School Plan is **Building and extending strong and effective partnerships for 21**<sup>st</sup> **Century education.** Through our meetings, surveys and discussions over the last 12 months, we identified that providing parents with clearer information and feedback about their children's learning was an important part of building that partnership.

Some steps to doing this are already well underway. At the end of the year, you will receive your child's report. We are using different software which will allow us to have more flexibility in the set up of the report. We are moving to using plain English in our teacher comments. We will be using dot points so that the information is clearer and less wordy. In English and Maths, teachers will be commenting on areas of strength for your child, and providing suggestions as to how they can further improve.

This week, we have sent home a Term 4 Curriculum Overview for each grade. This gives you an outline of the general content that will be covered this term, so that you can support your child's learning at home. This overview also shows you the content on which the student reports will be based. They complement each other.

Both the Curriculum Overviews and the student reports are "works in progress" and will be reviewed to see how they can be further improved.

Another way in which we are moving towards building and extending strong and effective partnerships is by forming a working party of teachers and parents to look at how feedback on learning is provided to parents. This working party will consider all aspects of feedback and consider how we can more effectively inform and involve parents in understanding their children's learning and progress, within the policies and frameworks of the Department of Education.

I thank our teachers, Assistant and Deputy Principals for their work in developing the curriculum overviews and the new student reports. We look forward to continuing to build strong connections with our parent community.

#### **Term 4 Curriculum Overviews**

As part of our ongoing commitment to provide parents with more information about your child's learning, class teachers have developed a curriculum overview which outlines the general syllabus content to be covered each term. We hope that this information helps clarify the types of knowledge and skills that your child will be learning this term. The new reports will reflect the information that is in the overview.

The overview refers to the general content of the grade/stage and class teachers will differentiate their instruction to ensure that the children who are working below the stage level will receive appropriate support, and students who are working beyond the general content will be extended.

The overview is in the draft stage and we welcome your feedback about whether or not this has helped you support your child's learning.

If you have any questions regarding the information in the overview, please feel free to ask your child's teacher, or alternatively, you are most welcome to discuss it with me.

## 21st Century Learning Corner



Welcome back to Term 4! This term we are continuing with our focus on **Creative Thinking skills**.

Creative thinking skills can develop new perspectives to assist with problem solving. They help students to apply and build on

knowledge across the curriculum, to deepen and create new meaning and understanding.



During our staff meeting, this week, teachers reflected on their teaching practices and considered ways to promote the creative abilities and skills of our students across the curriculum. We heard from a variety of teachers who have been implementing creative thinking skills in Numeracy, Science, HSIE and Literacy using a variety of tools such as "Ryan's Thinkers Keys", "iMaths" and the Creative Arts to develop students' learning outcomes. Teachers reported on students' increased problem solving, collaborative and communication skills and noticed that they were better at 'having a go' or 'taking a risk' when

attempting new challenges.

Watch this space for updates on how we are implementing creative thinking skills into the classroom and the impact this is having on students' learning.
