Principal's Message

Update on Road Safety Traffic Survey conducted by Georges River Council

On the 25th of October, the State Member for Kogarah, Mr Chris Minns visited Hurstville Public School to discuss a range of local issues. One discussion item that was presented by the school as a significantly high priority was road safety in the local area, in particular the Forest Road/Croydon Road/Orange Street precinct that includes five school sites, Hurstville PS being one of them.

At this time, members of the school administration and school community representatives voiced our concerns to Mr Minns that the investigation into this road safety/traffic management issue currently being conducted by Georges River Council seemed to be guite a protracted affair.

The school and community reps had actively engaged over a two year period in the consultation process for the review and development of a draft traffic survey report being commissioned by the council. After the last consultation meeting held by the GR Council on the 2nd August, 2017, we were anxious for the recommendations to be finalised and adopted.

We requested that Mr Minns support the school and school community reps in bringing the key stakeholders together to discuss this matter in greater detail, as it needed to be given the highest priority as a local area concern. Mr Minns was able to organise and attend a meeting at the school on Thursday 30th November which was also attended by Mr Kevin Greene, Mayor of Georges River Council, and members of the Traffic Engineering Department of the GR council who have led the community consultancy of the draft traffic report. A representative from NSW Roads and Maritime Services was also in attendance at this meeting.

In the weeks prior to this meeting taking place, the draft traffic study was tabled at the Georges River Council Traffic Advisory Meeting and titled - Hurstville Public School and Other Nearby Schools Traffic Study Findings. This report contains 19 recommendations in relation to proposed short and long term solutions for traffic safety issues within this precinct.

At the meeting held yesterday, 30th November, a number of these proposals were discussed at length and explored further by the attendees in terms of possible timeframes for implementation. The main items discussed concerned:

- Possible changes to the pedestrian crossing on Forest Road widening the crossing to 5.5 metres, extending the pedestrian crossing time to 10 seconds (up from 8 seconds) at school start and finishing times and finally, the installation of a Red Left Turn Arrow from Lily Street onto Forest Road to ensure people crossing the road at the pedestrian crossing can do so safely.
- The relocation of a bus stop on Forest Road from outside the school and the installation of some additional
 pedestrian barriers on the footpath so a second exit gate (Gate 3) from the school grounds can be opened
 onto Forest Road and alleviate the number of people exiting the school grounds at the gate near the
 pedestrian crossing on Forest Road.
- Possible installation of No Right Turn signage out of Kenwyn Street onto Forest Road to improve safety and to remove the constant gridlock of this intersection at morning and afternoon school pick up and drop off times.
- The possible installation of *Kiss and Drop Zone* signage on Kenwyn Street, adjacent to the school pedestrian gate. We requested that this be done in conjunction with the installation of the *No Right Turn* signage installation.
- Possible widening of the footpath on Orange Lane to ensure students and family members can walk along this area safely when there is a high volume of traffic in the area.

I would like to thank all of the meeting participants for their willingness to discuss and plan for these measures to be prioritised in the coming months. The safety of all students in this precinct needs to be the priority and it was clear that all parties in attendance were committed to improving the current situation.

I would especially like to thank our State Member for Kogarah, Mr Chris Minns for hearing our concerns and for taking the time, effort and energy to bring all stakeholders together for this important discussion about the safety of our young people in the local area. I would also like to extend this thanks to Mr Kevin Greene, Mayor of Georges River Council and his staff for setting aside this time to address this issue in detail. Finally, a thank you to the representative from the Roads and Maritime Services for his clarity around some of the issues faced in this precinct and his solutions focused approach.

I will keep you informed of any further developments in regard to this matter.

Repeat Item - 2018 Class Placements and Structure

During Term 4 of each year, the school's leadership team and stage teams spend quite a lot of time planning the class structure, staffing and class allocations for the upcoming school year. We have begun work on classes for 2018.

Many factors are considered when grouping children into classes for the next school year and it is never an easy task to get right for every child. Besides the Department of Education's guidelines about the student numbers in each class at different year levels we also consider:

- academic achievements levels
- special needs considerations (Gifted and Talented, students requiring Learning and Support assistance, special needs assistance)
- EAL/D considerations (how many years a student has been learning English)
- medical issues
- relationships that should be split or continued, (teacher-child, child-child)
- behavioural issues or concerns

- any relevant family issues
- students receiving funding support
- current referrals to the Learning Support Team
- teacher allocation

In circumstances where parents have particular concerns about the placement of their child for the next school year that involve any of the factors identified above, then now is the time to have a discussion with myself or a member of the school executive by phone or by email.






