Principal's Message

I am very pleased to have returned to Hurstville Public School for Education Week. From my very first moments back, I was immediately reminded of what a special and dynamic place this is. I would like to extend my most heartfelt thank you to Mrs Sally Lawson who relieved as Principal throughout the past 6 months. Mrs Lawson is an incredible educator and a fantastic leader who has made an important contribution to our school and wider community. Knowing that Hurstville PS was in the capable hands of Mrs Lawson and our amazing HPS team provided me with a great deal of reassurance during my time away. Our comprehensive school plan is well under way and a number of our key priorities are really taking shape and beginning to show clear evidence of their impact across the school.

Education Week last week provided a fantastic opportunity to highlight some of the amazing things our students and teachers have been undertaking and it was also a forum to begin an ongoing conversation with our school community about just what contemporary learning entails and what it means to our school.

Our Open Day presenters for the Transforming Schools workshop were Dr Michael Anderson, Dr Miranda Jefferson and Mr Dan Bell. All three have been working with teams from our school over the past 9 months on a transformation of our practice and operations via the 4Cs (Communication, collaboration, critical reflection and creativity) and with an explicit focus on the learning dispositions (see Page 2) required for successful learning. This has been an exciting and challenging journey so far, as we navigate and reflect on what makes the most relevant and robust education for our students and how we develop a commitment to lifelong learning from each and every member of our school community. This session was well supported and drew out some very important questions from school community members about how as a school community we can be part of this journey together and how we will provide community members with further insight into what this changing practice is looking like in our classrooms.

Community members who attended this workshop were also invited to return to the hall after visiting classrooms to participate in a gallery walk. The gallery we created was made up of examples of how each grade, our support unit and specialist teams were taking on aspects of this transformation and what it looked like in terms of classroom practice and learning dispositions.

We are looking forward to providing further opportunities for our community members to be a part of this learning journey with us. We are in the process of mapping out when these workshops will be taking place. We will keep you informed of this process.

Late Arrivals at School


Over the past few weeks, there has been an increase in the number of students arriving late to school. This is very disruptive to our office staff and most importantly, is recorded on each student's attendance record as a partial absence with the time they arrived and the reason they were late to school. The school day starts at 9am and it is an expectation that students are at school ready to line up with their class when the bell rings. Could you please support your child to ensure that they are arriving at school on time each day.

Arriving late to school also impacts on your child's learning. Have a look at the *every minute counts'* chart below.

Peer Support

Tell Them From Me student survey Frequently Asked Questions (parents and carers)

Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation

1. What is the *Tell Them From Me* student survey?

The *Tell Them From Me* student survey asks questions about factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other outcomes. It aims to help improve the learning outcomes of students. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the student point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

2. What kind of questions will the survey ask?

The survey questions relate to the following measures for **primary schools**:

Participation in sports and extra- curricular activities	Behaviour at school	Effective learning time

3. How have schools been selected to take part?

The survey is open to all NSW government schools at no cost to them. Your child's school has decided to participate.



4. How will taking part in this survey benefit my child's school?

The *Tell Them From Me* student survey will provide school principals and school leaders with insight into student engagement, wellbeing and effective teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students.

Data collected from the survey responses are quickly compiled into reports for school leaders. Principals can then use this information to help them identify emerging issues and plan for school improvement.

5. What does my child need to do to participate in the survey?

The survey typically takes less than 30 minutes and is conducted entirely online through a secure website operated by the survey developers, *The Learning Bar.* Schools will make computers or laptops available so that students can complete the survey during school hours.

6. Does my child have to participate?

No, participation in the survey is optional. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped. Parents/students have a right to apply for access to, and correction of, a student's information.

7. Will the school be able to identify my child from their responses?

Staff in schools will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will not be made available.

A small number of staff in the department's Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) will have access to individual student responses for the purpose of state-wide analysis. Individual students' data will be held on a secure server with access strictly limited to CESE researchers. The researchers are interested in trends only – not in individual student responses. No student will be identified in any publication. No school will be identified unless they have given permission.

8. What sort of analysis will be done on the survey data?

Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days. School leaders can use the data to better understand the experiences and views of students at their school.

CESE will undertake state-wide analysis of the survey data in conjunction with existing student data held by the department, including performance data.

The results will help all schools better understand the relationship between wellbeing, engagement, effective teaching and student learning. Results from CESE's analysis of this data will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes. This supports the department's continuing focus on quality teaching and leadership. The data will be retained for future analysis to help us better understand the nature of student engagement and wellbeing over time.

9. Can all school students participate in the survey?

The primary school survey is designed for students in Years 4 to 6. Schools are encouraged to allow as many students as possible in these year groups to participate. Secondary schools are encouraged to allow as many students as possible in Years 7 to 12 to participate.

10. When will the *Tell Them From Me* survey happen?

The surveys will be conducted in all participating schools at the end of Term 1 and (optionally) Term 3/4.



What is CESE?

The Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) is part of the NSW Department of Education.

CESE has been established to improve the effectiveness, efficiency and accountability of education in New South Wales. CESE will identify and share what works, creating new opportunities to improve teaching and learning across all of education.

What is The Learning Bar?

The Learning Bar specialises in research-based design and facilitation of student assessments and survey solutions for both primary and secondary students. The in-house research team led by the President, Dr J Douglas Willms, undertakes extensive projects used in the school system to affect national policy. It is against this research that the survey, *Tell Them From Me*, has become the largest national school survey in Canada, used in nine of the ten provinces. Globally, more than 6,300 schools and 5.4 million students have participated in the survey over the last twelve years.

Dr Willms recently held the Tier 1 Canada Research Chair in Literacy and Human Development. He plays a lead role in the development of questions on student engagement for the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA).

For purely administrative purposes, *The Learning Bar* will also have temporary access to identifiable student responses to the survey questions. Other than *The Learning Bar* and CESE researchers within the department, identifiable student responses will not be disclosed to any other person or body other than as required by law.

1. 什麼是"讓我告訴你們"學生問卷調查?

"讓我告訴你們"(Tell Them From Me)學生問卷調查針對那些已知會影響學生的學業成績和其他成就的因素提出問題,從而協助改善學生的教育成果。問卷調查的目的是在學校和教育系統層面衡量、評估與報告學生的洞察和觀點。新南威爾士州實施的調查焦點是探索學生福利、學生參與程度以及有效的教學 實踐。

2. 調查將問一些什麼樣的問題呢?

3. 哪些學校可以參與問卷調查呢?

所有新南威爾士州公立學校都可以選擇參與調查,完全免費。 你的子女的學校決定參加這個調查項目。

4. 問卷調查將如何使我的子女的學校受益?

"Tell Them From Me" 學生問卷調查將能夠讓校長和學校領導 團隊從學生的角度洞察學生在學校的參與程度、福利狀況和有 效的教學實踐方法。

通過問卷調查收集的數據將會迅速匯編成報告,送交學校領導 團隊。這些資訊可以幫助校長識別正在出現的問題,校長也可 利用這些資訊製訂學校改進方案。

5. 我的子女需要做些什麼來參與問卷 調查呢?

完成調查通常需要花費30分鐘的時間、完全通過本項調查開發和主持機構The Learning Bar提供的安全網站在綫進行。學校將 提供桌面電腦或筆記本電腦、以便學生在上課時間完成調查。

6. 我的子女必須參與嗎?

不。參與調查是完全自願的。如果你或你的子女不願意,他們 可以不參加。如果在回答問卷調查的過程中,有任何問題讓你 的子女感到不安,他們可以隨時停止。問卷調查中的大部份問 題都可以跳過。家長和學生都有權申請獲取或修改學生提供的 資訊。

7. 學校能否從我的子女的回答中識別他們?

學校工作人員無法根據回答識別學生的身份。為能確保資料保 密,所有參與調查的學生都將收到獨一無二的用戶名和密碼。 如果回答一個問題的學生人數不滿五人,其結果將不會得到 統計。 教育部下屬教育數據統計與評估中心(Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation – CESE)的少量工作人員出於分析全 州數據的需要將會接觸學生的個別回答。各個學生的數據將保 存在一個安全的伺服器上,嚴格僅限CESE的研究人員調用。研 究人員僅對趨勢感興趣,而不是個別學生對問題的回答。任何 出版物中都不會含有導致學生被識別的資料。除非學校允許, 否則我們不會識別任何學校。

8. 如何分析調查數據?

學生完成調查之後、有關結果報告在大多數情況下會在三個工作日內準備完畢,提供給學校。學校領導團隊能夠利用這些數 據更好地瞭解學生在學校的體驗以及他們對學校的看法。 CESE將結合教育部掌握的現有學生數據(包括學業表現數據) 對全州的問卷調查結果進行分析。

سيتمكن عدد قليل من الموظفين من مركز الإحصاء والتقييم التربوي ((Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE) التابع للوزارة من النفاذ إلى إجابات الطلاب الفردية بهدف إجراء تحليلات على
