Principal's Message

DanceSport Challenge 2018

On Wednesday evening 12th September, I was fortunate to attend the 2018 DanceSport Challenge held at Quay Arena, formerly the State Sports Centre at Homebush. This year is the second year that Hurstville Public School has been involved in the DanceSport Challenge and our team of students certainly did themselves and their school proud. It was amazing to witness the level of skill and commitment from all of the students in attendance, many having travelled from all over greater Sydney to be part of the challenge this year. I marvel at the fact that the Dancesport program runs over a 15 weeks period. 
'Buy a Bale' Kindergarten to Year 6 Fundraising Disco



Working With Children Check procedures- Volunteers need to bring 100 points of ID to the office in advance of the event and/or a volunteer Working With Children Check number Volunteer apply for working children check Service NSW

EXAMPLES of ID documents and the point value

Category 1 – 70 points

(Only ONE form of identification accepted from this category.)

- Birth Certificate/Birth Extract
- Australian Passport (Current, or expired within the previous two years, but not cancelled)
- Australian Citizenship Certificate
- International Passport (Current, or expired within the previous two years, but not cancelled)
- Other document of identity having same characteristics as a passport e.g. diplomatic/refugee (Photo or Signature)

Category 2 – 40 points

(More than one of the following documents may be counted. The initial document will score 40 points, and any additional documents will be awarded 25 points each.)

- Current Licence or Permit (Government Issued)
- · Working With Children/Teachers Registration Card
- ASIC/MSIC Card
- Public Employee Photo ID Card (Government Issued)
- · Department of Veterans' Affairs Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or Health Care Card
- Current Tertiary Education Institution Photo ID
- Reference from a Doctor (must have known the applicant for a period of at least 12 months)

Category 3 – 25 points

(More than one of the following documents may be counted; each will score 25 points.)

- Foreign/International Driver's Licence
- Proof of Age Card (Government Issued)
- Medicare Card/Private Health Care Card
- Council Rates Notice
- Property Lease/Rental Agreement
- Property Insurance Papers
- Tax Declaration
- Superannuation Statement
- Seniors Card
- Electoral Roll Registration
- Motor Vehicle Registration or Insurance Documents
- Professional or Trade Association Card

To use more than one of the following documents, they must be from different organisations:

- Utility Bills (e.g. Telephone, Gas, Electricity, Water)
- Credit/Debit Card
- Bank Statement/Passbook


