


## **Partners In Learning**



- ▶ Visitor's badge if you are visiting or helping in the classroom during school hours, you must get a visitor's badge from the office.






## **Parent and Community Involvement**






### **Before and After School Care**



The 4Cs assist us to engage in deep learning, establish connections and develop solutions. They support us in approaching real world settings and solving real world problems.
















## 4C Transformative Learning: Learning Disposition Wheel



The Learning Disposition Wheel has also been an integral part of our Transforming Schools journey. The Learning Disposition Wheel contains three interdependent domains:


- Cognition the ability to think and reason

#### MAKE AND EXPRESS MEANING


How do you interpret and understand what you are learning, how do you explain new ideas?

To be confident, selfcontrolled & calm


#### **GRIT**

## **Bell Times**

- ▶ **8.30am**: A teacher supervises students on Area 5 playground. Students are not to arrive before 8.30am.
- ▶ 8.40am: Bell rings and teachers are on duty
- ▶ 9am: School Starts
- ▶ **11-11.25am**: Recess
- ▶ 1.10-1.20pm: Supervised Eating Time
- ▶ 1.20-2pm: Play Time
- ▶ 3pm: School Finishes (Years 1 to 6)



Students should leave the school grounds promptly at 3pm

  - the canteen








## **Playground Expectations**

- Share equipment






## **Preparing For The Big Day**

#### **Before school starts:**


- Try on uniform and shoes
- Make sure your child's name is on everything
- Let your child practise carrying their school bag
- Encourage your child to go to the toilet by themselves
- Reassure your child that someone will be at school to pick them up each day
- Practise writing your child's name

## What To Do When The BIG Day Arrives

- It is important to arrive at the correct time indicated in your letter
- Smile try not to let your child see that you are anxious
- Take your child to their classroom, reassure them, hug and kiss them, and then say goodbye
- Be on time to pick up your child in the afternoon




## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)


- PBL is an evidence based whole school process to improve learning outcomes for all students










## **Awards**
