






Homework


- Generally homework is kept to a minimum










- Visitor's badge − if you are visiting or helping in the classroom during school hours, you must get a a visitor's badge from the office.










Before and After School Care

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)


- PBL is an evidence based whole school process to improve learning outcomes for all students




<u>Cognition</u>- the ability to think and reason
