


Partners In Learning

The more we know, the better we can accommodate for your child.






Communication With The School










Making Our School Safe

- ▶ Visitor's badge if you are visiting or helping in the classroom during school hours, you must get a visitor's badge from the office.










Before and After School Care

- ▶ 8.40am: Bell rings and teachers are on duty
- ▶ 9am: School starts
- ▶ **11-11.25am**: Recess
- ▶ 1.10-1.20pm: Supervised eating time
- ▶ 1.20-2pm: Play time
- 3pm: School finishes (Years 1 to 6)

► Term 1: first three weeks - pick up children at 2.30pm from their classroom


For the rest of the year pick up children at 2.50pm

- Share equipment






Preparing For The Big Day

- Be on time to pick up your child in the afternoon




Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)


- PBL is an evidence based whole school process to improve learning outcomes for all students





